	The Czech Authorities has taken immediate steps to ban the sale
	of alcohol over 20% in the markets and has confirmed that there
	is no export of the spirits to other countries.
	Acquisition of the products through international travel cannot
	be excluded.
	Symptoms of methanol poisoning include initially drunkenness
	and drowsiness (similar to ethanol poisoning), followed by
	vomiting, vertigo, abdominal pain, blurred vision leading to
	blindness and the risk of coma and death.
	Consumers should discard the products and not consume them
	and travelers should not bring back bottles of the local "hard
	liquor" as they could contain potentially lethal levels of
	methanol.
	CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development
	and take appropriate actions when necessary.
