Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Information on product distribution is not available from the FDA website. The local trade has been alerted. Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. <i>Salmonella</i> infection may cause fever and gastrointestinal upset such as abdominal pain and diarrhoea. People with lowered immunity such as infants and the elderly could present with more severe and even life-threatening infection. Consumers should discard the product and not consume it. CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.
