Heading	Department of Livestock, Ministry of Agriculture and Forests, THIMPHU, Bhutan notified the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) on a reoccurrence of Highly Pathogenic Notifiable Avian Influenza (HPNAI) H5N1 outbreak case that started on 14.1.2013.
The incident	A total of 76 backyard poultry died in Sarpang, Bhutan up to 18.1.2013. Trace- back investigations revealed there have been poultry deaths in the affected area from 14.1.2013. HPNAI was confirmed by the National Veterinary Laboratory on 16.1.2013 and subsequently by the HSADL (Bhopal, India) on 31.1.2013.
