Heading	Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries of Cambodia notified the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) confirmed three Highly Pathogenic Notifiable Avian Influenza (HPNAI) H5N1 outbreak cases that started on 18.2.2013 and 19.2.2013.
The incident	3 HPNAI H5N1 outbreaks reported in backyard poultry in NG. CHAM Province and KAMPOT Province. After having been reported by farmers that their poultry was sick and was dying, samples were taken by district and provincial veterinary services, and confirmed positive for H5N1.

Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Hong Kong did not import any live poultry or poultry meat from Cambodia, but there was a small quantity of poultry eggs imported from Cambodia. - In response to outbreaks of H5N1 avian influenza in Takeo Province in January 2013, the Centre for Food Safety has suspended import of poultry eggs from Cambodia since 31.1.2013. - CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.
