Heading	The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) - Rich Products Corporation announces a voluntary recall of Farm Rich® Mini Quesadillas, Farm Rich® Mini Pizza Slices, Farm Rich® Philly Cheese Steaks, Farm Rich® Mozzarella Bites, and Market Day® Mozzarella Bites due to possible contamination with <i>E. coli</i> O121
The incident	FDA issued a notice regarding a recall of some frozen chicken quesadilla and various other heat treated, not fully cooked frozen mini meals and snack items in USA by a NY firm, Rich Products Corporation, because the products may be contaminated with <i>E. coli</i> O121.

Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• According to FDA, the affected products have been distributed in certain regions of the U.S.</li> <li>• The local trade has been alerted.</li> <li>• Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.</li> <li>• <i>E. coli</i> O121 may cause symptoms like severe diarrhoea, bloody diarrhoea and abdominal cramps. Severe cases may develop haemolytic uraemic syndrome (HUS) characterised by acute kidney failure, and some may even die.</li> <li>• Consumers should discard the products and not consume them.</li> <li>• CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.</li> </ul>
