<b>Heading</b>	The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) - Certain Prince brand Tahini may contain <i>Salmonella</i> bacteria (Update)
<b>The incident</b>	CFIA issued an updated notice regarding the recall of certain Prince brand Tahini products (Country of origin: Israel) in Canada by UNFI Canada Inc. because the products may be contaminated with <i>Salmonella</i> .

<b>Position of CFS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• According to CFIA, the affected products are products of Israel and have been distributed in Canada. Information on product distribution outside Canada is not available from CFIA website.</li> <li>• The local trade has been alerted.</li> <li>• Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.</li> <li>• <i>Salmonella</i> infection may cause fever and gastrointestinal upset such as abdominal pain and diarrhoea. People with lowered immunity such as infants and the elderly could present with more severe and even life-threatening infection.</li> <li>• Consumers should discard the product and not consume it.</li> <li>• CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary</li> </ul>
