Information on product distribution outside the US is not available from FDA website.</li> <li>• The local trade has been alerted.</li> <li>• Acquisition of the product through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.</li> <li>• <i>Listeria monocytogenes</i> may pose health risk to exposed individuals, in particular pregnant women, newborns, the elderly and people with weak immunity who may present with severe infection including miscarriage and meningitis.</li> <li>• Consumers should discard the product and not consume it.</li> <li>• CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary</li> </ul>
