Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> According to the FSIS, the affected products have been distributed in the U.S. Information on product distribution outside the U.S. is not available from the FSIS website. Local trade has been alerted. Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. <i>Listeria monocytogenes</i> may pose health risk to exposed individuals, in particular pregnant women, newborns, the elderly and people with weak immunity who may present with severe infection including miscarriage and meningitis. Consumers should discard the products and not consume them. CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.
