Heading	The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) and the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA)– Recall of certain products containing frozen vegetables/ fruits/ sunflower seeds/ kernels in Canada, Mexico and US due to possible contamination with <i>Listeria monocytogenes</i> .
The incident	<p>The FDA, FSIS and CFIA issued notices regarding recalls of certain products containing frozen vegetables/ fruits/ sunflower seeds/ kernels by different companies because the products may be contaminated with <i>Listeria monocytogenes</i>. Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Information on product distribution outside the Canada/ Mexico/ US is not available from the FDA/CFIA website. CFS is investigating whether the affected batches have been imported to Hong Kong and is contacting the U.S. and Canada authority for further information. Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. Consumers should discard the products and not consume them. CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. Investigation by CFS is ongoing. Listeriosis is usually caused by eating food contaminated with Listeria which can be easily destroyed by cooking but can survive and multiply at refrigerator temperatures. Severe complications may occur, such as septicaemia, meningitis or even death in newborns, elderly and those with weaker immune systems; and miscarriages during pregnancy.
