The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) and the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA)—Recall of certain products containing frozen vegetables/ fruits/ sunflower seeds/ kernels in Canada, Mexico and US due to possible contamination with *Listeria monocytogenes*.

The incident

The FDA, FSIS and CFIA issued notices regarding recalls of certain products containing frozen vegetables/ fruits/ sunflower seeds/ kernels by different companies because the products may be contaminated with *Listeria monocytogenes*. These included
