Heading	Media reported that Israeli Ministry of Health ordered a halt to all sales of products containing tahini made by Prince Tahina and HaNasich recalled its hummus and tahini products in Israel because <i>Salmonella</i> was discovered in the products containing tahini.
The incident	<p>According to the reports of media, Israeli Ministry of Health ordered a halt to all sales of products containing tahini made by Prince Tahina and over 200 tons of Prince Tahina products are to be destroyed due to <i>Salmonella</i> was discovered on in Shamir salads, which contains tahini made by Prince Tahina.</p> <p>Furthermore, HaNasich, a subsidiary of Shamir Salads, reported on 10 August 2016 night that traces of <i>Salmonella</i> were discovered in samples of their raw tahini products. Shamir has issued a recall on the following items:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All hummus products with expiration dates ranging from September 1, 2016 to September 18, 2016. ● All tahini products with expiration dates ranging from September 16, 2016 to October 3, 2016. ● All eggplant tahini products with expiration dates ranging from September 1, 2016 to September 18, 2016. <p>Details of product being recalled is listed in the media website.</p>

Consumers should discard the products and not consume them. CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. Investigation by CFS is ongoing. <i>Salmonella</i> infection may cause fever and gastrointestinal upset such as abdominal pain and diarrhea. People with lowered immunity such as infants and the elderly could present with more severe and even life-threatening infection.
