<b>The incident</b>	<p>The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued a notice regarding a recall of shell eggs in the U.S. by Good Earth Egg Company LLC because they have the potential to be contaminated with <i>Salmonella</i>.</p> <p>This recall is related to a multistate outbreak of <i>Salmonella</i> Oranienburg in the U.S. linked to shell eggs distributed by Good Earth Egg Company (Food Incident Post dated 4.10.2016).</p> <p><b><u>Recalled Products</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Various sizes of shell eggs that are packaged in the following ways: 6-count cartons, 10-count cartons, 12-count cartons, 18-count cartons, 15 dozen cases, and 30 dozen cases. The dates and codes on the cartons and cases will include everything prior to and including date code 252 – Sell By 10/08/2016, with “Packed for” or “Produced for Good Earth Egg Company”</li> <li>● The recalled products were distributed throughout the Midwest, including Missouri, Illinois and Kansas, at the retail and wholesale level, institutions, restaurants and to walk-in customers. Good Earth eggs were sold at Dierbergs, Straubs, Midtowne Market and Price Chopper in the metropolitan St. Louis area.</li> </ul> <p>Details of the products being recalled are listed in the FDA website.</p>

<b>Position of CFS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Information on product distribution outside the U.S. is not available from the FDA website. CFS is investigating whether the affected product has been imported to Hong Kong and is contacting the U.S. authority for further information.</li><li>• Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.</li><li>• Consumers should discard the products and not consume them.</li><li>• CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.</li><li>• Investigation by CFS is ongoing.</li><li>• <i>Salmonella</i> infection may cause fever and gastrointestinal upset such as abdominal pain and diarrhea. People with lowered immunity such as infants and the elderly could present with more severe and even life-threatening infection.</li></ul>
