CFS is investigating whether the affected products have been imported to Hong Kong. Preliminary investigation revealed that one of the importers had imported and distributed the affected products. The importer concerned had initiated a product recall. A press release and trade alert were issued today.Acquisition of the products through online purchase or								

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	<p>international travel cannot be excluded.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consumers who are allergic to egg should discard the products and not consume them. • CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. • Investigation by CFS is ongoing. • People who are allergic to egg may have immunologic response like vomiting, diarrhoea and rash upon consumption of food containing this allergen. In severe cases, anaphylactic shock may even develop. As for other members of the public, generally speaking, they would not be subject to such reactions when the food in question is consumed.
