The incident	<p>FDA and CFIA issued recall notices of Dixie Diners' Club brand Carb Not Beanit Butter in US and Canada due to the possible contamination with <i>Escherichia coli</i> O157:H7. This is an expanded recall in relation to a multistate outbreak of Shiga toxin-producing <i>Escherichia coli</i> (<i>E. coli</i>) O157:H7 infections linked to SoyNut Butter in US. 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	<p>Preliminary investigation did not identify local sale or import of the affected product.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.• Consumers should discard the products and not consume them.• CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.• Investigation by CFS is ongoing.• Symptoms for people who were infected with Shiga toxin-producing E. coli (STEC) infections vary for each person but often include severe stomach cramps and bloody diarrhea. If there is fever, it is usually not very high (less than 101 degrees Fahrenheit disclaimer icon/less than 38.5 degrees Celsius). Most people get better within 5–7 days. Some infections are very mild, but others are severe or even life-threatening known as hemolytic uremic syndrome (HUS).
