Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Information on product distribution outside the Ireland is not available. CFS is investigating whether the affected batches have been imported to Hong Kong. Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. Consumers should discard the products and not consume them. CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. Investigation by CFS is ongoing. Nuts and nut products is one of eight types of allergens accounted for more than 90% of all food allergic reactions. Common symptoms of allergy include skin irritations, nausea, diarrhoea, sneezing and shortness of breath. Currently, there is no cure for food allergy. A severe food allergy can be life-threatening. Strict avoidance of the allergy-causing food is the only way to avoid a reaction. Individuals with food allergies need to rely on an accurate food label to choose food.
