Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • According to FSANZ the products were distributed in certain regions of Australia and in some Asian countries. • Local trade has been alerted. • The Australian Consulate General was contacted for more information. • Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. • The symptoms of paralytic shellfish poisoning are predominantly neurological and the onset is usually within minutes to hours after ingestion of the shellfish. Initial symptoms include tingling, numbness of the mouth and extremities and gastrointestinal discomfort such as vomiting and diarrhoea. • Consumers should discard the product and not consume it. • CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary
