The	On 12 June 2015, CFS received notification from the Rapid Alert
incident	System for Food and Feed (RASFF) of the European Commission that
	a small volume of smoked paprika powder, which was tainted with
	Salmonella, had been imported into Hong Kong by one importer.
	In response, a press release and trade alert were issued on the same
	day. Since then, CFS has kept in contact with the RASFF to monitor
	the situation. On 22 June 2015, we received update from the
	RASFF that one more local importer had imported 1 can of the
	affected product. The importer concerned was contacted
	immediately and it had submitted the affected product to CFS for
	disposal. No product had been entered into the local market.

Position of	Salmonella infection may cause fever and gastrointestinal upset
CFS	such as abdominal pain and diarrhoea. People with lowered
