The incident	<p>The FSANZ issued a notice regarding a recall of whole rockmelons from Red Dirt, a rockmelon grower in the Northern Territory because <i>Salmonella</i> was detected in samples of rockmelons from the grower.</p> <p>Details of product being recalled is listed in the FSANZ website.</p>

CFS is contacting the Australian authority for further information. • Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. • Consumers should discard the products and not consume them. • CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. • Investigation by CFS is ongoing. • <i>Salmonella</i> infection may cause fever and gastrointestinal upset such as abdominal pain and diarrhea. People with lowered immunity such as infants and the elderly could present with more severe and even life-threatening infection.
