Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Information on product distribution outside the US is not available from the CDC websites. CFS is investigating whether the affected batch has been imported to Hong Kong. Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. Consumers should discard the products and not consume them. CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. Investigation by CFS is ongoing. Salmonella infection may cause fever and gastrointestinal upset such as abdominal pain and diarrhea. People with lowered immunity such as infants and the elderly could present with more severe and even life-threatening infection.
