	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.• Consumers should discard the products and not consume them.• People contract <i>E. coli</i>, which is a gastro-intestinal infection, through consumption of contaminated water or undercooked and contaminated foods. Intestinal bleeding and serious complications such as hemolytic uraemic syndrome (HUS) may also develop in some people. Moreover, due to poor personal hygiene, person-to-person transmission of this pathogen is possible through oral-faecal route. <i>E. coli</i> cannot survive under high temperature and can be killed by thorough cooking.• CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.• Investigation by CFS is ongoing.
