Heading	The Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) – Recall of certain products containing boneless veal in US due to possible contamination with <i>E. coli</i> O26 and O45.
The incident	The FSIS issued a notice regarding a recall of certain products containing boneless veal by a company because the product may be contaminated with <i>E. coli</i> O26 and O45. These included (1) certain boneless veal products in the US by Gold Medal Packing Inc. Details of products being recalled are listed in the FDA and CFIA websites

Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Information on product distribution outside the US is not available from the FSIS websites. CFS is investigating whether the affected batches have been imported to Hong Kong and is contacting the U.S. authority for further information. Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. Consumers should discard the products and not consume them. CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. Investigation by CFS is ongoing. People can contract <i>E. coli</i> causing gastro-intestinal disease through consumption of contaminated water or undercooked and contaminated foods. Intestinal bleeding and serious complications such as hemolytic uraemic syndrome (HUS) may also develop in some people. Moreover, due to poor personal hygiene, person-to-person transmission of this pathogen is possible through oral-faecal route. <i>E. coli</i> cannot survive under high temperature and can be killed by thorough cooking.
