The Centre for Food Safety (CFS) is investigating whether the affected products have been imported to Hong Kong and is contacting the relevant authority for further information. • Acquisition of the products through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. • Consumers should discard the products and not consume them. • CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. • Investigation by CFS is ongoing. • Norovirus caused acute gastroenteritis worldwide in the form of outbreaks and sporadic cases in humans. It can be spread by

	<p>the faecal-oral route via contaminated food and water. Besides, person-to-person spread, contact with contaminated objects and aerosol spread are other major routes of transmission. Individuals suffering from norovirus food poisoning may show symptoms which include nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea and abdominal cramps.</p>
