	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Consumers who are allergic to or intolerant of soya should discard the products and not consume them.</li><li>• CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.</li><li>• Investigation by CFS is ongoing.</li><li>• People who are allergic to or intolerant of soya may have immunologic response like vomiting, diarrhoea and rash upon consumption of food containing this allergen. In severe cases, anaphylactic shock may even develop. As for other members of the public, generally speaking, they would not be subject to such reactions when the food in question is consumed.</li></ul>
