 Information on product distribution outside US is not available from the website of the FDA. The Centre for Food Safety (CFS) is investigating whether the affected product has been imported to Hong Kong and is contacting the relevant authority

for further information. Preliminary investigation did not identify local sale or import of the affected product.

- Acquisition of the product through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.
- Consumers should discard the product and not consume it.
- CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.
- Investigation by CFS is ongoing.
- Infant botulism is a rare type of botulism caused by the ingestion of Clostridium botulinum spores that germinate, grow and release toxins in the intestine of infants. Symptoms of infant botulism include constipation, flattened facial expressions, weak sucking, weak crying, reduced movement and muscle weakness. The symptoms can be mild in some cases but can be severe and even fatal in others.
