The Centre for Food Safety (CFS) is investigating whether the affected product has been imported to Hong Kong and is contacting the relevant authority for further information. Preliminary investigation did not identify local sale or import of the affected product.Acquisition of the product through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.Consumers should discard the product and not consume it.CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.Investigation by CFS is ongoing.Listeriosis is usually caused by eating food contaminated with Listeria which can be easily destroyed by cooking but can survive and multiply at refrigerator temperatures. Severe complications may occur, such as septicaemia, meningitis or
