Preliminary follow-up with Danone Nutricia Early Life Nutrition (Hong Kong) Limited, local importers and major retailers did not identify local sale or import of the affected product.</li> <li>• Acquisition of the product through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded.</li> <li>• Consumers should discard the product and not consume it.</li> <li>• CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary.</li> </ul>

- Investigation by CFS is ongoing.
- *Bacillus cereus* is commonly found in the environment. Unhygienic conditions in food processing and storage may give rise to its growth. Consuming food contaminated with excessive *Bacillus cereus* or its heat-stable toxins may cause gastrointestinal upset such as vomiting and diarrhoea.
