Position of CFS	- Information on product distribution outside the UK is not available from the website of the FSA. The Centre for Food Safety (CFS) is investigating whether the affected product has been imported to Hong Kong and is contacting the relevant authority for further information. Preliminary investigation did not identify local sale or import of the affected product. - Acquisition of the product through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. - Consumers with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents, wheat or gluten, or with coeliac disease should discard the product and not consume it. - CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development						

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and take appropriate actions when necessary.

- Investigation by CFS is ongoing.
- People with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents, wheat or gluten, or with coeliac disease may have immunologic response like vomiting, diarrhoea and rash upon consumption of food containing this allergen. In severe cases, anaphylactic shock may even develop. As for other members of the public, generally speaking, they would not be subject to such reactions when the food in question is consumed.
