Position of CFS	• Information on product distribution outside Czech Republic is not available from the website of Czech Republic authorities. The Centre for Food Safety (CFS) is investigating whether the affected product has been imported to Hong Kong and is contacting the relevant authority for further information. Preliminary investigation did not identify local sale or import of the affected product. • Acquisition of the product through online purchase or international travel cannot be excluded. • Consumers should discard the product and not consume it. • CFS will remain vigilant and monitor for any new development and take appropriate actions when necessary. • Investigation by CFS is ongoing. • Foodborne botulism is caused by ingestion of food containing very potent neurotoxin produced by <i>Clostridium botulinum</i>. Symptoms of intoxication include marked fatigue, weakness and vertigo, often followed by blurred vision and difficulty in speaking and swallowing. The toxin may paralyse the breathing muscles and cause death. Onset of symptoms is usually around 18 to 36 hours after the ingestion of the toxin, but may range from four hours to eight days.
